Making a grand total of 130 community participants of all ages, abilities and backgrounds who performed Handel's Semele four times at Blackheath Halls between Tuesday 26 September and Sunday 1 October 2023. With such a large and varied cast, Blackheath Halls Opera is always a substantial undertaking. In order to be fully prepared for the work, rehearsals began in July with sessions for the adult chorus and orchestra. Our youth company launched in August with an intensive week of rehearsals. All groups began working together as we moved into September. and our professional cast joined us a month prior to the first performance.


