Performing alongside our professional cast were:

- an adult chorus of 46 local people aged 18 80+
- 4 Trinity Laban vocal students
- a youth company of 32 local young people aged 9 16
- 6 students from local specialist schools Charlton Park Academy and Greenvale School
- Blackheath Halls Orchestra a group of 56 players aged 30 – 80+

Making a grand total of 144 community participants of all ages, backgrounds and levels of experience who performed Mascagni's Cavalleria Rusticana six times at Blackheath Halls between Monday 23 September and Sunday 29 September 2024. Rehearsals began in July with sessions for the adult chorus and orchestra. Our Youth Company started in August with their own week of rehearsals and learning about the opera. All groups began working together as we moved into September, and our professional cast joined us a month prior to the first performance.

YOUTH COMPANY




